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Kennel Selection & Preparation

1. Dimensions:

- a. The size of the kennel must be such that it will allow the dog to stand in a natural position, turn around easily, and to lie down in a natural manner.
- b. The data presented below gives a guideline for determining the correct size of the container. They relate to an animal standing in a natural position.

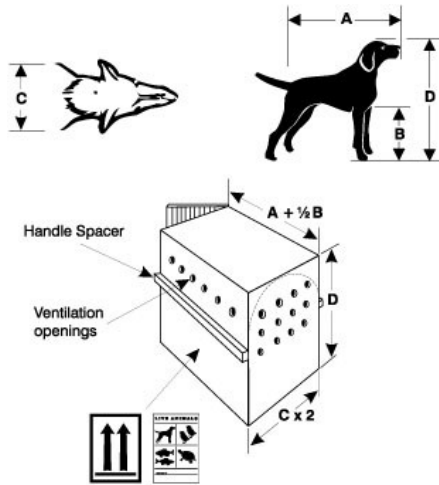
A = Length of animal from nose to base of tail

B = Height from floor to elbow joint

$(A + 1/2B)$ = length of kennel

C = Width across shoulders, $C \times 2$ = width of kennel.

D = Height of kennel = height of dog to top of head or tip of ears



2. When in doubt, use the larger size. One animal only per kennel.
